OUR FOUNDING

Founded in 2024, The Ace Serve Giveback is organized under the Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law for charitable purposes. There are over 7,000 homeless people alone in Orange County, who lack the basic necessities that most people take for granted. This includes essential supplies such as water, food, clothing, and much more. On top of that, over 33% of households in Orange county fall below the Real Cost Measure, which is a measure of poverty. That means that around 305,000 households out of the 924,000 household in Orange County fall below the poverty line. This inspired us to kickstart what is now known as The Ace Serve Giveback.





OUR MISSION

Our mission for this non-profit is to combine donations of necessary items, such as socks, to help others that are in need. We will also dedicate our time to enriching the lives of underprivileged children with tennis education. Through the Ace Serve Giveback, we hope to make a positive impact on those who are struggling, while also spreading awareness and respect, and turning our community into the best version of itself.

OUR GOALS



Donations

Our first goal is to provide socks to many different organizations that will distribute the items to those in need. This ranges from churches, homeless shelters, and elderly homes that are willing to help us accomplish our mission. We have distributed more than 10,000 pairs of socks so far to our beneficiaries.





Education

Our second goal is to provide underprivileged children with the chance to learn how to play the sport of tennis. In specific, we hope to educate through the allocation of 100+ service hours a year to tennis instruction and academic tutoring. This comes from our passion of the sport, each of us having played for more than 7 years. We hope to spread our passion for tennis to children who did not have the same opportunities to play the sport as we did while growing up.
